The role of the Academic Council is enumerated below:

- i. Implements the policy decisions taken by the Governing Council
- ii. Oversees the functioning of the Academic delivery team
- iii. Approves the curriculum updates and new course launches at the commencement of the academic year

Faculty Council

The Faculty Council includes all permanent, adjunct faculty and visiting faculty and meets once a month in the academic year and is presided over by the Principal. The purpose of the Faculty Council is to implement the academic decisions recommended by the Governing Council and Academic Council for running the Institute in keeping with the Vision, Mission, core values and strategic objectives of the institute. The Faculty Council also serves as a peer level sounding board for individual Faculty Members to bring up their teaching ideas and debate them within the group.

Constitution & Role of Student Council

The Students' Council is a body constituted usually in January every year and has a tenure till the end of calendar year. The students are selected to be part of an executive body on the basis of a rigorous evaluation based on a number of academic and extra-curricular activities. Within the executive body, the Council members democratically select the post bearers and functional committee members.

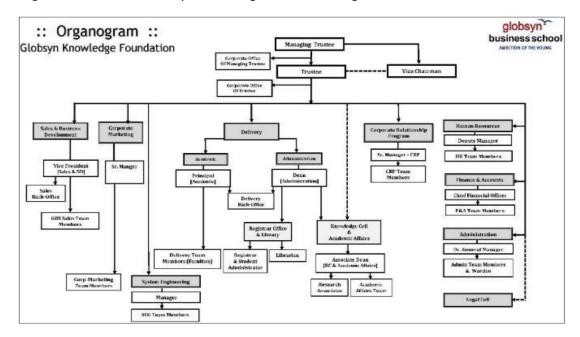

iii) Student Feedback on Institutional Governance/ Faculty performance

Globsyn Business School follows a procedure of taking student feedback throughout the duration of the 2-year PGDM program and formally at the end of each semester so that the Teaching-Learning process can be improved to enhance the effectiveness of academic delivery. The Feedback taken from students are immediately analysed and the reports are reviewed in the Faculty Council and Academic Council meetings.

Globsyn Business School has seamlessly moved from offline to online students' feedback from AY 2019-20 onwards thereby significantly reducing the turnaround time in faculty recourse. In AY 202-21, for the 1st year students (Sem I and II), in addition to the End Semester feedback interim feedback has been initiated to understand and analyse the effectiveness of digital learning and take corrective actions to improve academic delivery.

iv) Grievance Redressal Mechanism for Students

The objective of setting up a Grievance Redressal Committee is to develop a responsive and accountable attitude among all the stakeholders in order to maintain a harmonious educational atmosphere and to prevent unfair practices in the institute. A Committee is setup to deal with Grievances received in writing from the students about any concern related to Academics, Finance or any other. Student files an application along with necessary documents, if any, to the Office of the Registrar (via mail or written application). The office of the Registrar fixes the date, time and venue/virtual platform of the meeting after having a discussion with the committee members.

• Criteria for Fee waivers/scholarship

National Scholarship Scheme

At Globsyn Business School (GBS) we believe in acknowledging excellence achieved by meritorious students in academic and extra-curricular pursuits and recognising talent from a holistic point of view. As a part of this ongoing initiative, GBS offers various scholarships to the students of its Post Graduate Management Programmes. The aim of the National Scholarship Program (NSP) is also to recognise merit from a broader perspective to include those who have excelled in non-academic areas.

Objective

The aim of the Scholarship Schemes is to provide financial relief to some meritorious students from economically disadvantaged families so that they may pursue their PG education at GBS without the burden of fee expense.

Allocation of Scholarships

Scholarships come under, broadly two categories: Economically Disadvantaged and Socially Challenged.

- 1) Kalyani Scholarships (for students from economically disadvantaged background)
 - a. No. of students: 7 (seven)
 - b. Quantum of Scholarship: 100% fee waiver (except Admission Fee)
 - c. Eligibility:



- Students with an exemplary academic track-record, whose parents' or guardian's income falls below the criteria as specified under 'Parental Income Ceiling', will be eligible for the Kalyani Scholarship.
- The minimum academic criteria required for students to avail this and the other scholarships mentioned below:

Class 10/equivalent: >= 75% Class 12/equivalent: >= 75%

Graduation: >= 60%

Qualifying Aptitude Exam (CAT/MAT etc.) >= 80 percentile Other outstanding achievements (documentary proof required)

- Furthermore, the students awarded scholarships must maintain an academic CGPA >=
 6.0 in all Semesters at GBS and actively participate in the institute's Beyond Education activities.
- The students' performance would be reviewed after every Semester for consideration to continue the fee waiver.
- d. Administration of Fee Waiver: All installments of fee (except initial Admission Fee) will be waived. If any installments have already been paid, these will be refunded after the due date of the last installment that would have normally been due.
- **2) Outstanding Achievers Scholarships** (for students achieving recognition or excellence in sports or culture/arts areas).
 - a. No. of scholarships: 6 (three each in Sports and Arts)
 - b. Quantum of Scholarship: Rs. 1,00,000 each
 - c. Eligibility:
 - For Sportspersons, the student must have been recognised by a prominent sports body/association at the State or National level in any outdoor or indoor sporting event.
 - In the Arts area, students achieving recognition or excellence from prominent bodies/associations at the Regional or National level in any areas such as Debate, Quiz, Dance, Drama etc. will be eligible.
 - In addition, the students' parents' or guardian's income should fall below the criteria as specified under 'Parental Income Ceiling'.
 - Furthermore, the students awarded scholarships must maintain an academic CGPA >= 5.0
 in all Semesters at GBS and actively participate in the institute's Beyond Education
 activities.
 - The students' performance would be reviewed after every Semester for consideration to be eligible for partial fee waiver.
 - Administration of Fee waiver: The fee waiver will be applied in two parts. The first part 50% (i.e. Rs. 50,000/-) will be reduced from the penultimate installment and remaining 50% reduced in the last installment.

Parental Income Ceiling

The parental income should be Rs. 8 lakh per annum for both categories of Scholarships. Students will have to furnish income certificate or self-attested copy of last income tax return for their parent/guardian along with copy of Aadhar Card (or equivalent identification allowed by the Government) for both student and parent.



Opening of NSP and Selection Procedure

- The application for Scholarships may be submitted by filling out the form provided below.
- Shortlisted applicants will be interviewed by a Scholarships Committee chaired by Dean, along with at least two other senior Faculty members who may include the Principal, within one month of the closure of all applications.
- At the interview, applicants will have to present all documentary proof for verification, including academic credentials, income documents, identity proof etc. as required for the Scholarship.
- After the interview, the recommendations of the Scholarships Committee based on a comprehensive evaluation on several criteria, will be sent to the Director for final approval. Director may choose to carry out a second level of interview.
- Final list of Scholarships awarded will be announced.

General

- a. All Scholarship based fee waivers will apply to Programme/Course Fee only. There will be no waiver of any other charges such as re-examination fee, any student activity charges, library charges, hostel charges, any late payment charges etc. that may be applicable.
- b. Scholarships will not be given to students who are already availing the benefit of any other scholarship from anywhere else. A declaration to that effect will be taken. Scholarship may be cancelled, and other penal action taken if declaration is found to be false.
- c. Students are expected to maintain the dignity and prestige of GBS at all times. If any disciplinary action, on any front is taken against the awarded students during their course of study, the scholarship will be forfeited.

Instruction methods and pedagogical initiatives

(i) Use of Technology to Enhance Learning

 eGlobsyn
 – In-house developed Learning Management System of Globsyn Business School since its inception.

With the core rooted in technology, GBS uses technology to not only supplement the knowledge dissemination system but also to make the students more 'technology' aware – a pre requisite for today's corporate environment. All students and faculty at GBS have access to 'eGlobsyn' – an Online Learning Management System with web 2.0 applications and cloud computing. The study materials provided by the faculty in various forms like power point presentations, class notes, preparatory questions, articles, case studies, videos etc. are accessed by the students through the portal. The performance of students is measured through online assessments on a regular basis. Academic calendar, notices, announcements, weekly class schedule are published through eGlobsyn. The 'career' section is a predominant feature in eGlobsyn to provide students access to employability enhancement resources with the following features like daily news updates, current affairs, writeups for group discussion topics, Frequently Asked Questions in Personal Interviews and Company Profiles. The eGlobsyn portal enables students to ask questions to their faculty regarding any particular session by clicking on the 'Ask your Faculty' tab available in the tabs where the content of each session is uploaded. eGlobsyn also has an interactive Social Section where students and faculty can upload blogs and have discussions in different forums.

eGlobsyn Library is a new introduction in eGlobsyn to enhance digital learning during COVID 19. Due to the lockdown imposed by COVID-19 nationally since March, 2020, the students have been unable to visit the campus Library to access the books and to do research that helps with their coursework. GBS has made sure that students always have access to books and videos to facilitate their learning. To give shape to this endeavour, GBS has launched an eLibrary - a digital repository of more than 13,000+ books and 500+ videos as a part of eGlobsyn, a web 2.0-based LMS portal used by the faculty and students.

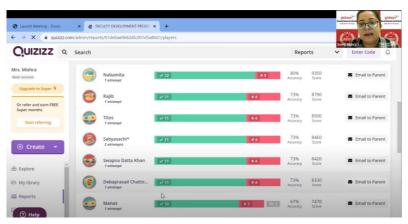


Introduction of gamification in pedagogy:

Gamification in education is a strategy for increasing engagement and enhancing the learning experience of students by incorporating game elements into an educational environment. Gamification involves using game-based elements such as point scoring, peer competition, team work, score tables to drive engagement, help students assimilate new information and test their knowledge. Gamification can be incorporated to conduct pre-assessments, formative assessments, as a part of the course delivery etc. to understand, review and evaluate the student's learning. It can be incorporated at different stages of a course depending on the course and the discretion of the faculty. Gamification works because it triggers real, powerful human emotions such as happiness, intrigue, excitement and accomplishment. There are various gamification platforms available in the market. For example, Kahoot, Quizizz, Mentimeter, Socrative.



We have introduced Quizizz in our pedagogy. Quizizz is a gamified student engagement platform, this is an online assessment tool that allows teachers and students to create and use one another's quizzes. After providing students with a unique access code, a quiz can be presented live as a timed competition or used for homework with a specific deadline. After the quizzes have been completed, students can review their answers. Furthermore, the resulting data is compiled into a spreadsheet to give the instructor a clear visual of the student's performance in order to analyse trends in which areas might need the most focus in the future. This immediate feedback can be used by teachers to revise future learning activities and alter the focus of the material by putting a larger emphasis on concepts that students are struggling with. we are using this software in all the semesters as formative assessments and pop quizzes.





(ii) Experiential Learning

GBS seamlessly blends in the experiential learning methodology in its curriculum to enable the students to engage in application-oriented learning. Our delivery structure is divided into classroom lecture and experiential learning in the ratio of 2:1.

Case based teaching, student's participation in live projects, Boardroom Simulation Activity, Industry Visits, Role Plays, Activity Based Learning etc. all form a part of experiential learning activities.

Case Based Teaching

The case method of teaching requires students to study the case, comprehend the business situation, analyse the problem and come up with alternative solutions. Case Method requires active participation in classroom discussions, written analysis and oral presentations.

The case discussions are conducted by dividing the students into groups or by throwing open the issue to the class for discussion. The faculty observes the contribution of every member of the group and ensures their participation. The students are evaluated on the basis of the following criteria:

- i. Comprehension of the case
- ii. Ability to diagnose the problem
- iii. Level of participation, initiation and the strength of the argument
- iv. Generation of alternatives and their probable consequences
- v. Presentation and communication skills

Boardroom Simulation Activity

Globsyn Business School believes in 'Learning by Doing' or Learning through Experience' and has introduced Boardroom Simulation Activity as a key component of the PGDM Program that replicates the tensions of real leadership challenges to develop life skills required in a business environment.

The activity culminates in a role-play of a Boardroom Meeting where experienced company executives chair the session and provide guidance, direction and feedback. Students work in small teams under the guidance of a faculty mentor. Every member of the team is assigned specific roles of Executive and

Non-Executive Directors. Corporate Executives assign a problem statement to each team for Research and Analysis. The teams finally present the findings and solutions to the given problem in a Board Meeting.

The activity enables students to integrate all the functional areas of management and understand business in a holistic manner, gain insights into leadership skills, attitude and behaviour that supports an organization's business strategy for leading change and engage with corporates for an exciting and meaningful learning experience.

Industry Visits

Industry visits sensitize students to the practical challenges that organizations face in the business world. Industrial visits also give greater clarity about various management concepts for students as they can practically see and understand how these concepts are put into action. Some snapshots of industry visits made by our students in the pre-Covid years as well as virtual industry visit during covid period are as follows:

Activity Based Learning (ABL)

Activity Based Learning (ABL) has been conceptualized with an aim to create a seamless holistic value delivery network beyond the regular classroom activities. Some snapshots from the Corporate Connect sessions in AY 2021-22 are as follows:



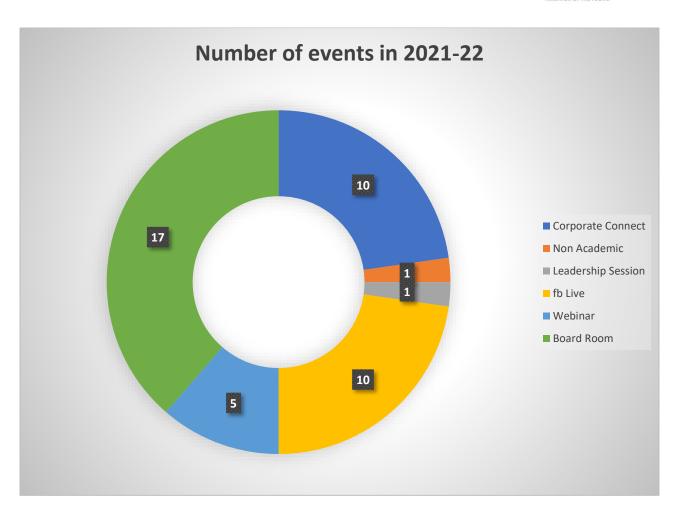


Webinars

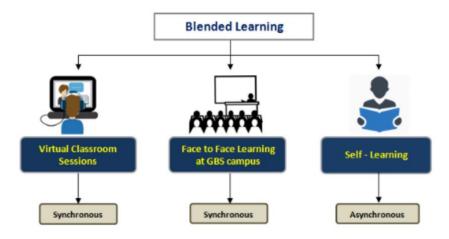




iv) Blended Learning Pedagogy in response to COVID-19

GBS has integrated the Blended Learning Model for academic delivery in AY 2020-21 to ensure effectiveness of digital learning executed due to COVID-19 lockdown since March, 2020. The Blended Learning Model has been developed considering the following:

- I. Knowing Doing Being Framework
- II. Synchronous & Asynchronous Learning
- III. Virtual, Face to Face & Self Learning





In AY 2021-22, the focus has been on the effective execution of the blended learning model comprising synchronous and asynchronous modes of learning.

• Synchronous Learning via virtual sessions on Zoom platform

Regular classroom sessions are conducted virtually by GBS faculty members on Zoom platform to deliberate on the course content – the session details are vividly depicted in the updated curriculum of each course uploaded on eGlobsyn. Virtual classroom sessions conducted by the faculty are dedicated to facilitate students acquire higher order skills in a synchronous mode – application of knowledge, analysis and discussion of cases, working in groups, evaluation of different scenarios to solve problems and recommend suitable solutions through presentations.

In addition to the regular classroom sessions, **doubt clearing sessions** are conducted on regular intervals by GBS faculty to discuss and clarify doubts of the students specific to the course.

Virtual office hours is a new introduction made to make remote learning more effective and allows students to interact with their faculty members beyond the scheduled online classroom sessions and doubt clearing sessions. Virtual Office Hours in an open forum where students can meet the faculty virtually during specified hours to interact and discuss open-ended issues beyond the subjects. In these sessions the faculty provides guidance in areas such as career mentoring, time management, professional and personal code of conduct etc.

Tutorial sessions are conducted by the research associates to help the students who are less proficient, students from non-commerce background and the students who are late joiners to cope up with the courses so that their understanding and learning is at par with other students in the batch.

• Experiential Learning through Synchronous mode

GBS focus on developing managerial skills for practical application of the acquired knowledge via Experiential Learning i.e., Learning by Doing. To develop the 'doing' skills of the students, the virtual course delivery includes group discussions, case studies, projects and group assignments.

Experiential learning that involves group work are executed virtually by using the Breakout Room feature of Zoom portal which enables the students to work in groups and allows the faculty member to join every group in order to track their progress and provide guidance.

Sessions on Beyond Education activities are also conducted by the faculty-in-charge and the students to plan, organize, coordinate, monitor, discuss and conduct various Beyond Education Activities such as KYLF events, Embryon, Management Conference, Serendipity and other student events.

In addition to the experiential learning sessions conducted by GBS faculty, Industry-Academia Connect sessions are conducted by veterans from the industry. The different categories of Industry-Academia Connect sessions that are conducted include Corporate Connect, Webinars, Social Awareness sessions.



Asynchronous Learning

- Recorded session videos by GBS faculty in eGlobsyn

GBS course delivery is executed in a flipped classroom methodology subject to the specific requirement of each course. The asynchronous pre-recorded video links of every course is uploaded on the GBS LMS portal — eGlobsyn. Students are expected to learn and acquire knowledge in an asynchronous mode prior to synchronous classroom sessions.

- Content and e-books in eGlobsyn

The course outlines, presentations, additional reading materials of every session is uploaded in eGlobsyn portal. In addition to the session specific content, 15000+ books and 500+ videos are uploaded in the eGlobsyn e-library section for the reference of the students even while studying and learning from home.

- Learning through GBS Online Courses

Student Development programme, an initiative of GBS is offered to the students providing them with an opportunity to learn online courses in addition to their post graduate management curriculum. Upon successful completion of the Student Development programme the students will be receiving ecertificates for each of the online courses through Blockchain Technology. The online courses being offered to students include courses such as How to Learn Online, Digital Marketing, Industry 4.0, Performance Management & Competency Mapping, Financial Markets and Investments, Product & Brand Management etc.

v) Employability Enhancement and Placement Mentoring (EEPM)

Employability Enhancement and Placement Mentoring is an initiative to make students more employable and placement-friendly so that the conversion of placement opportunities to job offers enhance. In addition to the regular academic curriculum-wise deliberations, the EEPM activities are designed keeping in mind the structure of various placement rounds and the expected skillsets that the students must possess.

GBS has taken the following EEPM initiatives:

• EEPM Weekly Exam on Aptitude and GK though eGlobsyn LMS:

Every week the students appear for eGlobsyn quizzes on Aptitude and GK to ensure that they regularly practice the concepts learnt by them in the Professional Skills Development course and to ensure that their knowledge about current affairs is up to date. The EEPM quiz on GK and Aptitude is conducted every weekend, the exams having a window from Friday 8:00 pm to Monday 8:00am. The results become instantly available to the students so that they can understand, analyse and improve their performance. The performance of students is monitored by the Knowledge Cell regularly and feedback is shared on regular intervals to help the students perform better and well equipped to excel in the placements.

• News Room:

News Room is the learning approach that aims to accelerate the student's general knowledge by sharing and discussing different news ranging from business to politics, corporates, sports, technology and lifestyle trends. News Room is a subset of EEPM (Employability Enhancement & Placement



Mentoring) that brings the real-world problems into the classroom. Newsroom sessions are conducted fortnightly beyond the regular classroom activities to help students to intensify their employability quotient and give them that much-needed edge in the hiring process.

This platform enables to clear doubt of the students, exchange perspectives and ideas, interpret own thinking, and critique the thinking of others. This class is followed by the quiz sessions which augment the students' participation in acquiring the knowledge and make them placement ready.

News Room sessions primarily enables students to:

- Improve the knowledge on current affairs which enrich their level of competency
- Stimulate learning, reading, writing, listening habit as well as speaking skills which are fundamental in students' academic performance
- Be socially responsible, empathetic and critically independent thinking citizens capable of working together to identify the social problems in a wide range
- Foster interaction between the students and the faculty
- Upgrade academic knowledge among the students regarding their subject area
- Resources uploaded in eGlobsyn:

In addition to the other EEPM initiatives, the Knowledge Cell continuously adds various resources of the Career section of eGlobsyn portal which include the following:

- Daily News Update and Weekly update of Current Affairs
- Interview Tips to deal with Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)
- Group Discussion Tips and Comprehension
- Subject FAQs on Finance, Marketing, Human Resource Management, Economics, etc
- Company Profiles of each corporate participating in the placement
- Mock GD/PI to groom students for placements

Mock Group Discussions and Personal Interviews are conducted by faculty members to groom the students and prepare them for their final placements. In AY 2021-22, in addition to the existing practice of conducting mock Group Discussions and Personal Interviews by faculty members, mock GD and PI is also conducted by our senior alumni members, independent corporate executives and by our internal Placement team (CRP Team).

vi) Learn and Intern

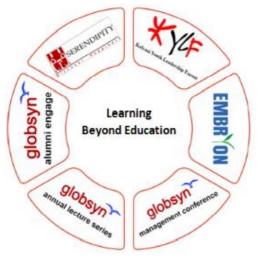
Learn and Intern forms one of the major pedagogical innovations in the academic delivery system of GBS. Learn and Intern sessions are conducted by the Executive Chairman and Founder of Globsyn Group, Mr. Bikram Dasgupta, a first-generation entrepreneur and among the stalwarts of the Information Technology revolution in the country.

It derives its uniqueness from the self-pressure model enunciated in a series of highly participative lecture series. The self-pressure model expects each participant to continuously excel by setting 'apparently' unachievable targets – targets which at the first glance looks impossible but which can be achieved if the participant were to push their boundaries little further than they would normally do. These sessions mentor students to become target oriented and help them plan and achieve targets by working backwards. The progress of each student is personally monitored by our founder-chairman in the areas of academics, attitude, extra-curricular activities, employability quotient etc.



vi) Beyond Education

Over the years, Globsyn Business School has gauged and acknowledged the contribution of participation in these activities in the overall development of the students and has made it an integral part of the PGDM Program Architecture by assigning 2 credits to Beyond Education.

The performance of the Fire Fighting System as incorporated in the buildings were tested at random and found satisfactorily working condition. In view of the above this office is releasing the Renewal of Fire Safety Certificate for occupancy of the aforesaid building.

However to up-keep the Fire Safety Measure of the aforesaid building the following safety measures need to be incorporated / maintained.

- Driveway must be free from any type of obstruction for easy movement of Fire Appliances. No parking will be allowed on the driveway.
- The interior finish decoration of the building shall be with low flame spread material confirming I.S. specification.



- To eliminate risk of Fire hazards, good housekeeping both for inside and outside of the building shall be strictly maintained.
- Existing electrical wiring of the whole building shall have to be carefully checked for wear and tear in them, particularly lines above false ceiling.
- The notice of Fire fighting and evacuation from the building shall be prepared and displayed at all vulnerable place of the building.
- The employees and security staff shall be conversant with installed Firefighting equipments of the building and to operate in the event of Fire and testing.
- Mock Fire practice and evacuation drill shall be performed periodically with participants of all the occupants of the building.
- Electrical switch gear room shall be protected with automatic CO2 or D.C.P Fire extinguisher confirming I.S. specification.
- 9. First aid Fire fighting system shall be provided as per I.S. specification.
- 10. Arrangement shall have to be made for regular checking, testing and maintenance of all the Firefighting installation in the building to keep them in perfectly good working condition at all the times.
- 11. If required the old lines shall have to be replaced with new lines, the cable shall always be laid in M.S. Conduits pipes continuously bonded with earth.
- Periodical flashing of water from the fire water pipe line shall be made to maintain efficient working performance of above mentioned system.
- 13. This F.S.C. is valid for 03(Three) years from the date of issue of this letter.
- 14. R.F.S.C is to be obtained from the Divisional Fire Officer, West Bengal Fire & Emergency Services, for performances of all the Life and Fire Safety arrangements and installation of the building.

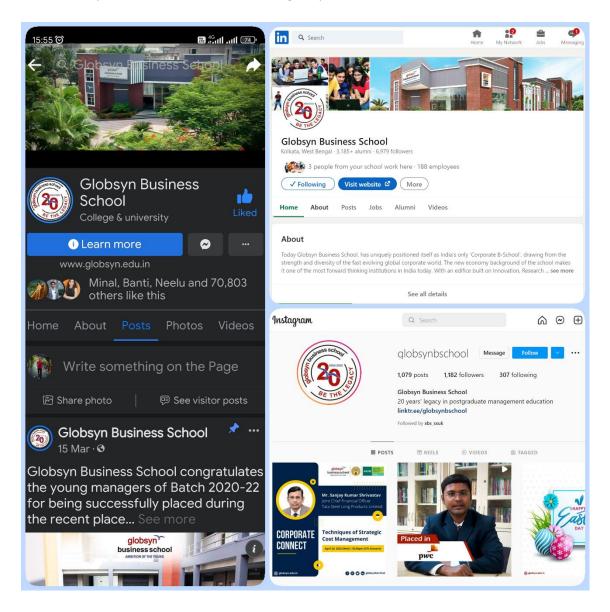


Annexure 3: Social Media Cell

• Internal Continuous Evaluation System and place:

Quality of continuous assessment and evaluation processes

Assessment plays a pivotal role in any training/educational program. The main objective of assessment is to acquire requisite information about students' performance and progress. Continuous assessment provides a clear picture about the learning and teaching process. Assessment helps in improving the efficiency and effectiveness of teaching methods and learning programs. It also acts as a feedback mechanism for instructional processes that evolves over time.

The courses are designed with an objective that after completing the course, the students are expected to achieve the Course Outcomes (COs). The COs for each course are mapped with Program Outcomes and are developed on the basis of Revised Bloom's Taxonomy. Globsyn Business School follows a system of continuous assessment using multiple methods. The assessments are done to measure the knowledge, skill and application abilities of students with respect to the intended course learning outcomes.

The assessment focuses more on higher order skills of Revised Blooms Taxonomy like -

Application Analysis Evaluation Creative thinking

At Globsyn Business School we use a number of assessment tools throughout the program tenure to measure our students' academic performance in an effective and efficient way. Our assessment tools are designed in such a way that learning outcomes are evaluated systematically on the parameters covering every aspect of the management program.



Globsyn Business School envisages a very comprehensive evaluation process for all semesters which basically comprises two components:

1) Formative Evaluation

The broad objective of the continuous evaluation is to assess every student on a real-time basis spread over the entire semester. Students are also given feedback of the same through our LMS portal eGlobsyn about their performance, enabling them to improve accordingly. Faculty members also share subjective feedback about the students during the classes on an on-going basis. The components of continuous evaluation differ from course to course depending on the course requirement. The components of the continuous evaluation system at GBS include the following:

- Case Presentation: Students are given a number of cases on different topics for analysis purposes. They are required to solve case problems and related questions in a stipulated time frame. This is conducted to evaluate students' analytical skills, problem solving skills and understanding of core concepts. It also helps to build decision making skills which are of utmost importance in the professional world.
- Assignment: Assignments measure how students have understood the subject matter as well as practical application of acquired knowledge. A number of assignments are given on different topics to assess students' performance during the semester. The type of assignment varies with each subject.
- eGlobsyn Quiz: We conduct online quiz test for different subjects through our e-learning platform. Students are required to attend the online quiz test within a specified time period. As soon as they submit the responses the obtained score is displayed. It is one of the tools to assess how comprehensively the students have gone through the curriculum.
 - In addition to the scheduled eGlobsyn quizzes that are conducted regularly, during the digital learning period due to COVID-19 lockdown the faculty conduct surprise eGlobsyn quizzes in between the live zoom classes where students login to the portal to appear for the assigned quiz and then return back to the session at the designated time for further discussion. This helps the faculty to understand if the delivery is effective and if the students are being attentive and learning.
- Class Participation: Class participation is one of the assessment techniques used to evaluate students' ability to grasp the knowledge of a subject on a regular basis. It helps to measure students' attentiveness and responsiveness in the class.
- Quizizz: We have introduced Quizizz in our pedagogy. Quizizz is a gamified student engagement platform, this is an online assessment tool that allows teachers and students to create and use one another's quizzes. After providing students with a unique access code, a quiz can be presented live as a timed competition or used for homework with a specific deadline. After the quizzes have been completed, students can review their answers. Furthermore, the resulting data is compiled into a spreadsheet to give the instructor a clear visual of the student's performance in order to analyse trends in which areas might need the most focus in the future. This immediate feedback can be used by teachers to revise future learning activities and alter the focus of the material by putting a larger emphasis on concepts



that students are struggling with. we are using this software in all the semesters as formative assessments and pop quizzes.

2) Summative Evaluation:

The formal evaluation is a structured written examination which tests the students' ability to grasp important key concepts and apply them in real life situations. The formal evaluation system is done through the End-Semester Examination.

End-Semester Examination: It is one of the major assessment tools used to measure students' performance in a semester. This is conducted to assess students' knowledge on each and every subject through written examination at the end of the semester. The questions are designed in such a way that the assessor gets a clear picture of students' understanding of the subject matter. The type of questions varies with each subject and the total marks allotted and duration of the exam for one credit paper is less than that of two/three credit papers.

The End-Semester Examination is conducted in an open-book exam mode to suit the current situation due to COVID-19 since March, 2020. The open book examination method of assessment has been designed in a way that allows students to refer to class notes and summaries, textbooks or other approved material while answering questions. The questions are designed to test skills such as application, analysis and evaluation – higher order skills in Bloom's Taxonomy.

GBS Online Exam (Open Book)

Globsyn Business School (GBS) with its quest for continuous innovation in management education has always provided its students with the most innovative learning pedagogy. During lockdown Globsyn has been exploring various ways to offer an outstanding and transformative learning environment to its students with the use of technology.

In accordance to the various options mentioned in the guidelines issued by the AICTE on 1st May 2020, GBS has been conducting Open Book Examinations in the online mode for all examinations since then. An "Open Book Examination" is a method of assessment designed in a way that allows you to refer to class notes and summaries, textbooks, or other approved material while answering questions. The Open Book Exam will test your capability to comprehend the question, identify issues, apply various theoretical principles, strategies, techniques, etc. that may have been taught and frame an analytical answer to the problem raised, with the help of supporting reference material.

Examination Paper Submission

GBS Examination Cell (exam.central@globsyn.edu.in) had implemented a new process for submission of answer scripts at the end of the online open-book examination. The top-sheet (examinee



identification sheet), the answer book (main document) and the optional add-on sheets (rough work etc) needed to be uploaded via a Google Form, the link for which was provided in the mail every day, along with question papers.

After finishing the exam, the students need to click on the link given in email for exam. paper submission. At this point of time the students should have at least 2 files [(1) Top Sheet (2) Answer Sheet] with them for uploading but in-case they have any additional sheet (For rough calculations) than only they will have 3 files for uploading.

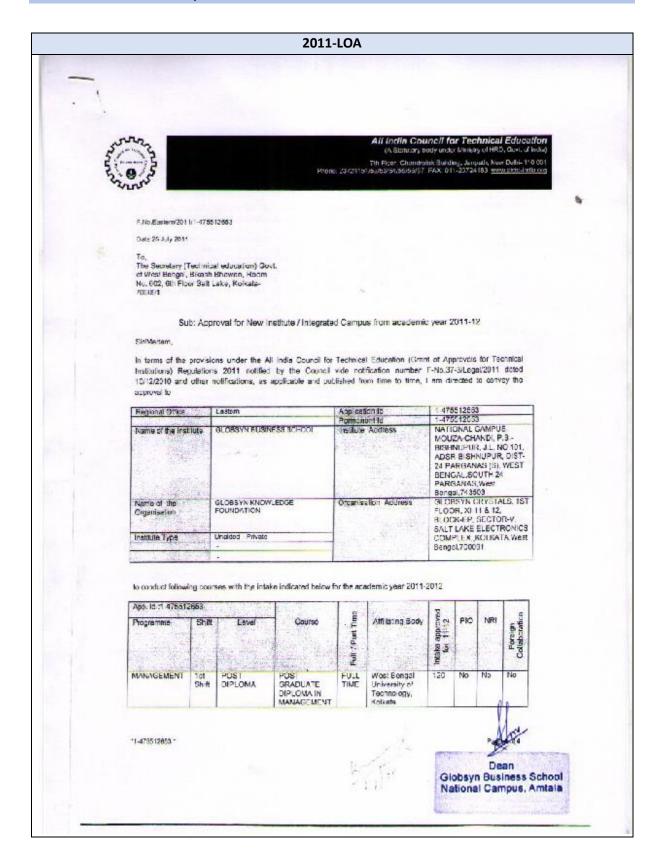
